


Where do you live? (180 responses)

## 2. How long have you lived here?


How long have you lived here? (186 responses)




Which age group do you belong to? (187 responses)


## About You – Conclusions

- The above shows that we gained 188 responses (175 adults and 12 over 11 year olds). With the additional 52 responses from under 11s, this leads us to believe that we have a good and sufficiently representative response from all sections of our community, except teenagers. Should we do anything regarding teenagers?
- Some of the results in the survey may warrant analysing by sub-populations, such as male and female, or working and retired.
- We do not know how happy or not our community is with life here, but we do have some initial pointers above re areas for focus.

The Holly Bush appears the most used facility and the Methodist Chapel the least. However, even the Holly Bush has considerable potential for additional use.








Would you use the following if they were available in the community?

Would you be willing to regularly give time to help run/stock the following?




A community shop generates more willingness to give time, but it would also need more time.

Where do you currently shop for most of your food and essentials?






Do you want to have a Village Hall in the Church Broughton area? (180 responses)

20. Would you be willing to do any of the following in order to have a Village Hall?







The first three ideas in particular do not necessarily require wide community support to succeed. Perhaps the concept might be trialled via a heating oil buying group and developed from there?


## Facilities and Amenities – Conclusions

- The Holly Bush is used most by responders compared to other facilities surveyed, but there is considerable potential for further use by the community. The survey gives many ideas as to how use may be grown, which we will share with the pub.
- There are lots of ideas for activities within the village that might be held at a Village Hall, or other suitable facility such as a revamped Church and Chapel school room, which appear very underused. There is a lot of energy and willingness to help to build on. The survey does not tell us which option is best for the village, and this should be investigated further by a working group.
- Responses re the school will be shared and discussed with them.
- There is demand for a Village Shop, but whether it is sufficient to warrant the effort and expense involved is unknown at this stage. Fall back options remain vending or mobile services. This might be a project for a working group.
- There may be value in trialling a heating oil buying group as a step towards a wider set of communal shared services and activities.










## Sports & Leisure – Conclusions

- The existing facilities are considered to be important, but there is a lot of interest in having extra sports facilities, particularly a MUGA
- There is some interest in having an allotment and quite a bit more interest in having a community garden/orchard
- There were a lot of varied suggestions for additional and alternative uses for the football pitch next to the school; we need to ascertain whether this would be possible
- There is lots of interest in doing additional activities which could be progressed if there is enough motivation to organise the activities
- The activities will drive the need for meeting places/facilities, either through the improvement of existing facilities or the requirement for a new Village Hall


How often do you use public transport in our area?

If you use Dial-a-Bus, which routes do you use?










Lack of transport is a problem for a number of people

38. How concerned are you by the following in our Community?




The biggest issues are the flooding of roads, traffic speed, and condition of the roads (including icy conditions)




This shows fairly strong support for information to be provided about flooding on the local roads. But can we do anything to resolve or improve the problems?




## Transport – Conclusions

- The existing transport systems are not often used, but lack of public transport is a problem for a number of people
- There is some interest in car sharing, and a significant level of interest in a link bus to Hatton
- The key concerns are the condition of the roads, speeding, lack of public transport and flooding of roads
- The issues need to be reviewed with the Parish Council and Derbyshire County Council to see what can be done to improve the situation



47. In general, what is your feeling on housing development in the community?


**In general, what is your feeling on housing development in the community?**

49. Should the Parish support the establishment of any of the following?


**Should the Parish support the establishment of any of the following?**


- There is some support for some more housing, although a similar number don't want any more housing; very few want significant new housing




That's a significant majority, but we need the commitment from enough people to make it happen






## Health Conclusions


57. How often do you work from home?

How often do you work from home? (175 responses)




58. What type of internet connection do you have?

What type of internet connection do you have? (182 responses)




59. How happy are you with your internet speed at home?

60. Which mobile phone network do you use


Which mobile phone network do you use (177 responses)

However, 30% of people with standard broadband are happy or very happy with it. 54% of responders have fibre (fast) broadband. Of those with fast broadband, only 56% are happy or very happy with the internet speed.

61. How happy are you with your mobile phone signal in your home?


How happy are you with your mobile phone signal in your home? (181 responses)

62. Do you receive the monthly Church Broughton Calendar?


Do you receive the monthly Church Broughton Calendar? (183 responses)

63. How useful do you find the Church Broughton Calendar?


How useful do you find the Church Broughton Calendar? (173 responses)



The Calendar is considered to be useful or very useful by the majority of recipients.


64. Are you registered on the Church Broughton website?

65. How often do you use the following?


How often do you use the following?

66. How often do you read community notices in the following locations?


How often do you read community notices in the following locations?


Would you be interested in any of the following?



## Work & Communications Conclusions

- There does not appear to be a connection between mobile provider and satisfaction with phone signal
- There is some dissatisfaction with internet connection even when it is fast broadband (fibre) and some people are happy with standard broadband
- The Calendar has a wide circulation and is considered to be very useful by many
- There is only limited interest in additional communication via Facebook or a newsletter
- A starter/information pack with details of facilities and services and a list of contacts for tradespeople is considered to be important by a large percentage of responders

## Conclusions from Young People's extra questions


- Lack of transport is a major issue – Derby/Hatton/Hilton being the most popular destinations (Hatton/Hilton probably to meet friends, Derby for shops and “fun”). A Link bus would meet both requirements.
- The majority of our teenager responders feel safe in the village
- They engage in a wide range of activities, but meeting friends/using the internet/watching TV top the list
- Internet usage is mainly for homework & social networks
- They would like more organised activities, particularly team sports and a village run
- They would like more activities for teenagers at the May Day celebrations
- They complain that there is little for teenagers at the park. One thing raised is the poor surface/facilities for playing football
- There are a number of issues they have raised which we can look at to improve their lot


Where do you live? (51 responses)


### 3. Are you a boy or a girl?





7. How often do you go to the following places:




6. How do you usually travel to school?




All of the school children go to the Church occasionally with the School, so those saying just Family above can be counted in Both, which gives 21 (40%).

We did not ask when children go to church with their family, so we do not know if it was specifically for a church service.



10. Would you like to take part in any of these activities?










Would you like any of the following in Church Broughton? (50 responses)

Lots of children say that it is great/fun/good/epic, etc, which is nice to see. Otherwise, one or two interesting comments:

- ⑩ gets very muddy when wet so can't use
- ⑩ taller football nets
- ⑩ better if play equipment was placed together (x2)
  - ↳ so my mummy can be with me and my older sister at the same time
  - ↳ so you don't have to walk through a football game to get to the big slide

The muddy goal area of the football pitch is a known issue, and VH&PFC do intend to periodically move the goals slightly to avoid one patch of grass being worn away. The request for taller nets is interesting; are the current goals "standard" 5 a-side sized goals? Taking into consideration some comments on the main questionnaire on danger of small children being hit by stray footballs, teenagers should probably be encouraged to use the full-size football pitch. Maybe if a MUGA this would provide a "safer" medium sized pitch and goal, then the grass goals could be moved closer together which would suit the younger age footballers, and possibly allow the play equipment to be placed together, or simply free some space to allow more equipment.
